

The above silver seal was found during excavations on the east side of Baldock Street, Ware in 1983. The excavation was carried out by the Hart Archaeological Unit and the East Herts. Archaeological Society Excavation Group.

It is thought that the seal may have belonged to a senior official of the Alien Benedictine Priory which was founded c. 1078 in that area of Ware.
